

Camp and Covid-19 – February 2022 update

Early in the pandemic, the SaskAbilities Board of Directors identified three priorities for our organization. These priorities align with our vision – working together to build inclusive communities for people of all abilities – and our mission – Supporting people experiencing disability with programs and services to enhance their lives - and help to sustain our organization. The first priority is to continue to support individuals experiencing disability, and to do so safely. The second priority is to keep staff members safe and to protect to the best of our ability pay and benefits for staff members. The third priority is to be a responsible corporate citizen and do our part to slow the spread of COVID-19. These three priorities have guided, and continue to inform, our response to the pandemic.

We have introduced changes to how we provided programs and services and worked with one another. We began adapting programs and services and how we support individuals experiencing disability. Some programs and services continued as is, some saw reduced client volumes, some were modified and provided remotely, and some programs and services paused. Camp Easter Seal programming pivoted to virtual programming, *Camp Connected*, as we continued to keep connected to our campers across the province these past two years.

The only constant during the pandemic has been the necessity to continue to adapt our programs and services and how we work with each other.

Camp Easter Seal and all in attendance (including staff, campers, and guests) will follow all current Government and Public Health guidelines, as well as SaskAbilities protocols. Guidelines and protocols are subject to change and up-to-date information will be made available to registered campers closer to camp session dates.
