



SEASONAL CASUAL POSITIONS: Recreation Program Workers (multiple positions available - various specialties)

A camp tradition for over 65 years, Camp Easter Seal, a signature program of SaskAbilities, offers the best outdoor summer recreational camp experience for children, youth and adults experiencing disability in Saskatchewan. It's a place where campers can explore, grow, and build friendships and independence. This safe, warm, fun and supportive environment fosters inclusion and belonging; a place where campers are the center of all we do.

Under the supervision of the Program Leader, the **Program Worker** is responsible for providing leadership and the oversight of a specific program area, in accordance to <u>SaskAbilities' policies and procedures</u>. This includes, but not limited to, planning activities and ensuring safe implementation of activities for cabin groups. Program Workers also participate in collaborative planning and implementation of camp-wide and evening programs. The ideal candidates will have strong leadership and initiative skills, be a team player, demonstrate energy and enthusiasm and have a good sense of fun and humour. The ability to manage stress and multiple demands is necessary. Program Workers are expected to embody and demonstrate <u>SaskAbilities' values</u>.

Education and Experience:

- Educational background/experience in recreation, kinesiology, education, disability studies, social work, or related programs
- Demonstration of experience in adaptive program planning is essential
- Experience and interest in a specific program area (see specific details below)
- Previous experience working or volunteering with persons with disabilities considered an asset
- Previous camp experience is an asset

General Qualifications & Skills:

- Organized and detailed-oriented
- Creative, adaptable and engaging, an outside-the-box thinker
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills
- Ability to positively interact and openly communicate with campers and staff
- Ability to create a respectful environment working with people of varying abilities
- Ability to prioritize work and handle multiple demands under pressure
- Must be able to meet the physical and emotional demands of the role
- Final candidates are required to provide satisfactory Criminal Record Check (CRC)

Under the direction of the Program Leader, the Program Worker will:

- Develop and lead innovative activities for all participants that are unique to the camp environment and meet the overall program objectives
- Ensure activities are imaginative and flexible (i.e., taking weather, energy levels, and physical, medical and emotional needs into consideration)
- Lead campers, together with their Support Leaders and Workers, in details of program area, safety protocols and planned activities
- Assist Support staff in adapting the activities to the specific needs of campers





- Advertise and promote programs to campers and staff
- Facilitate a program area orientation for the staff, ensuring they understand and are comfortable with all the equipment, policies and emergency procedures
- Recognize the hazards of the program, the variety of participant abilities and the environmental factors
- Perform daily safety audits and take steps to ensure hazards are removed or minimized
- Promote camper choice, engagement, and adaptability to ensure campers' recreational and social needs are
 positively and safely met
- Share ideas and resources with other Program Workers
- Maintain confidentially regarding staff and camper personal information
- Participate in regular meetings with the Program team led by the Program Leader
- Together with the Program Leader and other Program Workers, lead the development and implementation
 of group activities, campfires, evening programs and camp-wide programming
- Perform ongoing informal and formal evaluation of programming to ensure objectives are met
- Work with the Program Leader to develop a program supply list and ensure equipment is safe and maintained
- Participate in maintenance and cleaning of all program equipment and areas, end-of-session reset, as well as at the end of the camping season processes
- Take an active role in supporting and participating in aspects of camp life including assisting with camper care as directed by the Program Leader
- Attend and actively participate in all staff training sessions and meetings
- Other duties as requested by the Camp Manager or Program Leader

Availability

- Available to work 40-hour weeks, Monday Friday, on site, May 21 to August 23, 2024
- Camp is located at Manitou Beach, SK; transportation to and from site is personal responsibility

Compensation & Benefits:

- \$17.73/hour, 40 hour week based on a 6 to 12 hour daily shift schedule, on a Modified Work Agreement
- Staff are invited to live on-site during camp sessions accommodations and meals are provided during camp sessions and included in pay
- Access to SaskAbilities' Employee and Family Assistance Program
- All staff leave on days off (weekends and statutory holidays)
- Invitations to staff and alumni events and celebrations
- A tremendous sense of accomplishment, strong friendships, and a host of unforgettable memories

Specific Recreation Program Worker Roles, Qualifications & Skills:

Arts & Crafts Program Worker

In addition to general program duties, this Program leader will:

- Provide a wide variety of activities related to arts and crafts while further developing camper's appreciation, enjoyment and skills surrounding art.
- Attention is focused on multiple sensory activities to engage a wide range of people experiencing disabilities
- Provide a "camp specific" flavour to camper activities

Pool Program Worker (Head Lifeguard)

In addition to general program duties, this Program Leader will:

- Plan a wide variety of pool activities that are safe, fun and adapted so that all can participate
- Perform daily audits of the pool (including water testing) & equipment
- Act as Head Lifeguard for the camp
- Valid Class 5 Driver's license required as you may be required to drive camp vehicles
- Must possess current NLS Lifesaving Certificate
- Must be 18 years of age (Saskatchewan Camping Association requirement)
- Swimming Pool Operators Course an asset

Waterfront Program Worker

In addition to general program duties, this Recreation Program Worker will:

- Plan outings on, and drive camp pontoon boat, ensuring activities are safe, fun and adapted so that all can participate
- Coordinate, based on camper skills and interest, other waterfront activities (canoeing, liaise with water-ski volunteers (when available) and more)
- Work with other staff (facility and management) to ensure the pontoon boat is launched and pulled out as required for safety and maintenance
- Must possess current NLS Lifesaving Certificate
- Must be 18 years of age (Saskatchewan Camping Association requirement)
- Valid Class 5 Driver's license required as you will be required to drive camp vehicles
- Pleasure Craft Operator's Certificate required
- Paddle Canada Certificate an asset

Sports & Games Program Worker

In addition to general program duties, this Program Leader will:

- Plan a wide variety of sport and game activities that are safe, fun and adapted so that all can participate
- Experience and training in adaptive sports is an asset
- Manage the Sports Shed and inventory





Music and Drama Program Worker

In addition to general program duties, this Program Leader will:

- Plan a wide variety of music and drama activities that are safe, fun and adapted so that all can participate
- Lead in the preparation of a weekly talent show
- Training and/or experience in arts or music therapy is an asset

Rustics Program Worker

- Provide a wide variety of activities related to the outdoors, nature appreciation, and "rustic" adventures that are safe, fun and adapted so that all can participate
- Manage the Rustics shed and inventory
